Late 19th / early 20th century gold, platinum, diamond and ruby crossover snake ring, c.1900,

with two snakes forming a crossover style at the heads and with a two row shank, one formed by a snake in platinum with an old pear cut diamond to the head and ruby eyes, the other by a snake in gold with cushion cut ruby to the head and diamond eyes, the bodies looping around and tapering to the tail wrapping at the shoulders, textured scale style finish to the half hoop, the diamond approximately 0.45ct, the ruby approximately 0.65ct
Head 17.2 x 14.1 x 6.1mm deep

Pear diamond approximately 5.8 x 4.4 x 3.1mm

Cushion ruby approximately 5.1 x 4.5 x 3.0mm
